

# DERMALUX CONSULTATION GUIDE

Certain medications may increase the risk of a light sensitive reaction. Clients taking these medications may be contraindicated for the Dermalux treatment or should be treated with caution and closely monitored. Photosensitivity means a reaction to normal amounts of light. If in any doubt, please refer to a medical practitioner for guidance before treating.

RETINOIDS (ORAL & TOPICAL)	Isotretinoin	Wait 5 days after the client has stopped taking the medication before treatment

ANTI-ARTHRITIC	Auranofin	Dermalux MUST NOT be administed under any circumstances

NON-STEROIDAL ANTI-INFLAMMATORY DRUGS (NSAIDs)	Naproxen	If the client has been taking this medication for less than 7 days, additional Dermalux treatments may be required to achieve the desired results.

# CONTRAINDICATIONS AND PRECAUTIONS NOTES

Epilepsy or Seizures triggered by light	If the client has not experienced a seizure for at least 5 years, seek medical practitioner consent prior to treatment. For all other circumstances, <b>DO NOT</b> treat.	
Cancer in partial remission	Clients in partial remission from cancer should obtain medical consent from their medical practitioner.  Clients in full remission are safe to treat.	
Eye Disease and Conditions	These include Glaucoma, Cataracts, Age-Related Macular Degeneration and Laser Eye Surgery.  If a client is currently undergoing or has had recent treatment for an eye condition, seek medical practitioner consent prior to treatment.	
Pregnancy	Dermalux LED systems have <b>NOT</b> been tested on pregnant women and therefore the risk to the foetus or pregnant women is unknown. Consent to treat during pregnancy should be at the clinic's discretion.	
St John's Wort	Taken in regular high doses, this may increase the risk of a phototoxic reaction.	
New Skin Care Products	Certain ingredients such as vitamin A are known to increase light sensitivity and skin can go through change as it adapts to new products. This must be considered when combining with the Dermalux LED treatment.	
Client under 16 years old	There are no age restrictions for the Dermalux treatment. For clients under the age of 16 years, seek parental consent. Insurance policy guidelines must also be considered.	
Life Style	Clients who smoke, use sunbeds or have regular sun exposure should be advised that additional Dermalux treatments may be required to achieve the optimum result.
